

2023 PDGA UNITED STATES AMATEUR DISC GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP PRESENTED BY DISCRAFT

Welcome to the 2023 PDGA United States Amateur Disc Golf Championship, presented by Discraft, makers of the world's finest flying discs. On Sunday, June 11, 2023, a new United States Amateur Disc Golf Champion will be crowned. You have shown that you are an elite player and have earned the opportunity to compete for this PDGA Major title. Congratulations!

The Kensington Metropark Toboggan Disc Golf Course made its debut at the Discraft PDGA Pro/Am World's in 2000. Back then, Discraft owner Jim Kenner designed the Toboggan course for a 3.5-hour round of disc golf. For most who play the course today, that length-of-play target still holds true.

In 2002, the United States Amateur Disc Golf Championships (USADGC) moved onto the Toboggan and became the events home course. Every year since, the Toboggan has been the home for this PDGA Amateur Major. Todd White was the USADGC initial Tournament Director, and the first champion was Scott Burnett #20173, from Ohio.

Jim Kenner, Todd White, and Scott Burnett are forever associated with the PDGA United States Amateur Disc Golf Championship on the Kensington Metropark Toboggan Disc Golf Course.

To host a PDGA Major takes a lot of dedication, time, and effort. We would like to thank the entire staff at Discraft who are dedicated to making this event something truly amazing. The pictures for your personalized discs will be taken by Discraft's photographer Shane Law. He will work closely with Discraft's artist Allison Griwicki and turn your pictures into an event commemorative keepsake in two short days. It is an amazing process. 

2023 PDGA US Amateur Disc Golf Championship Event Schedule PLAYERS MEETING: Thursday, June 8, 2023 at 7PM at HOLDENS

Friday tee times will be posted online at www.PDGA.com following the Players Meeting.
Saturday tee times will be grouped by Friday's score with the highest score teeing off first.
Lowest two-day total will tee off LAST on Sunday. Highest two-day total tees of First on Sunday.

This Event will be a True Amateur event. Competitors will recieve more than their entry fee in players pack and additional event value. Payout will be TROPHY ONLY.

This is a PDGA AMATEUR MAJOR event. All PDGA rules will be followed

All Park roads and parking lots are OB

Smoking off the premises on holes 3,8, 13, 16 is allowed.

There is a PDGA approved Drop Zone on Hole 3 & 9 for lost drives only.

- For a Tee throw that is lost, the player must proceed to the provided Lost Disc Drop Zone with a penalty throw,
 - a re-tee is not an option as the Abandoned Throw rule is suspended for Tee throws on this hole.
 - For all subsequent throws that are lost, the player has the choice of either

the Lost Disc Drop Zone or their previous lie, both with a penalty throw. In the event of a tie for first place, a sudden death playoff will occur, as defined in 1.09 D.

The holes played are 1, 17 and 18. The tournament director will use a coin toss to determine who will throw first on hole 1.

Playoff Format:

- Only first place ties will be played off.
- Use holes 1, 17, and 18 is the traditional loop.
 - · Repeat until decided.
- Players will flip order on every tee shot until a winner is determined.


